



Antoaneta Boeva spent nearly ten years at NATO HQ in Brussels, including as a gender adviser, before spending her last six years there in the Office of Legal Affairs. During that period, she worked on issues relating to protection of civilians, international cooperation and privileges and immunities, alongside numerous other NATO governance and policy issues.

In 2015 she joined the ISMLLW and the Leuven Manual project, first as a contributor in her private capacity, but then she also assumed the role of Observer for NATO.

Antoaneta graduated the law school of the University of Grenoble, with a Masters Degree in International Law of Security and Defence. She later completed an Advanced LLM from the Leiden Law School, this time focusing on peace, justice and development, and conducted her research under the supervision of Professor Nils Blokker.

Antoaneta recently left Brussels for a younger international organization in southern France, where she's building the world's largest nuclear fusion reactor as part of the Office of Legal Affairs in the ITER Organization.

The areas of her research and professional focus are gender and protection of civilians issues, as well as topics related to NATO and international organizations' governance.
