

Antoaneta Boeva spent nearly ten years at NATO HQ in Brussels, including as a gender adviser, before spending her last six years there in the Office of Legal Affairs. During that period, she worked on issues relating to protection of civilians, international cooperation and privileges and immunities, alongside numerous other NATO governance and policy issues.

In 2015 she joined the ISMLLW and the Leuven Manual project, first as a contributor in a private capacity, but then she also assumed the role of Observer for NATO.

Antoaneta left Brussels in 2017 for a younger international organization in southern France, where she was building the world's largest nuclear fusion reactor as part of the Office of Legal Affairs in the ITER Organization. In 2021, she joined the Green Climate Fund as Legal Counsel and moved to South Korea where she lives with her family.

Antoaneta graduated from the law school of the University of Grenoble with a Masters Degree in International Law of Security and Defence. She later completed an Advanced LLM from the Leiden Law School, this time focusing on peace, justice and development, and conducted her research under the supervision of Professor Nils Blokker.

The areas of her personal interest and professional focus are intersectional, and she is particularly interested in gender issues, climate, and their relationships with security. Additionally, issues related to international organizations' governance continue to be a specific area of attention for her.
