# **About CIHOL**














- Founded 2019 Palacký University & Czech Armed Forces

#### **Focus and Mission**

- Focus: IHL, operational law, ius ad bellum, international criminal law & connected areas of international and national law
- Mission: bridging academia and practice & innovation
  - Institutional framework for bridging academia and practice at national and international level in the area of IHL
  - Promoting and spreading knowledge of IHL
  - (Excellent) research, teaching, training
  - Innovative & Tailored
- Broader cooperation:
  - Czech MoD, JCBRN Defense CoE, ICRC, UNHCR, universities



### **Camp Peira – Basic Characteristics**







- Launched 2016
- Intensive, scenario-based IHL simulation
- Civil—military co-organisation and cooperation
- Legal focus: IHL at core, but interdisciplinary
  - linked with IHRL, int. refugee law, role of non-state actors, NGOs and international organisations
- Participants (~150)
  - Civilians (2 universities, mainly law, but also other students)
  - Military (various units, lawyers, University of Defence)
  - International Organisations, NGO-s, state authorities


















# Camp Peira – Methodology (Core Elements)

#### Edu LARP simulation

- Predominant method adapted for legal and military education
- SIR (Scenario + Incidents + Roles)

#### Live Exercise (LIVEX)

- Real military environment (Vyškov), real participants
- Variability of fictional scenarios
- Constructive scenario design elements
- "Fog & friction of war"
- Realism measures (e.g. scarce or poor-quality food for civilians)





# Camp Peira – Methodology (NATO links)

- Mirrors mission rehearsal exercises
  - Possibility for participating military units to integrate Camp Peira into mission rehearsal / predeployment preparation
- Live-Virtual-Constructive (LVC) design elements integration
- After-Action Review
  - enriched with academic reflection (tailored to relevant audience/participants)





## Camp Peira – Methodology (Benefits)

- Realism: decisions under stress, uncertainty, time pressure
- Interdisciplinarity: law in context
- Civil—military trust and mutual understanding
- Innovative pedagogy: high effectiveness of Edu-LARP + extended AAR
- Innovative feature: civilian and military as equal learners





# Camp Peira – Challenges & Lessons Learned

- Reconciling different training approaches (directive vs. EDU LARP/open-ended)
- Defining joint and separate learning objectives of civ & mil participants
- Balancing realism, safety, and accessibility
- Managing expectations
- Continuous refinement: each edition generates new aspects to adjust
- New challenge: demand to internationalise (foreign armed forces & participants)
