

Philipp Hermes is a German lawyer, security professional and reserve officer with more than two decades of experience in international law, military affairs, security and civil-military engagement.

He currently serves as Global Military Advisor at the Center for Civilians in Conflict (CIVIC), where he supports engagement with military and security actors on the protection of civilians and the mitigation of civilian harm in armed conflict.

Philipp has served in national, NATO and EU military environments, including NATO Mission Iraq and EUFOR Operation ALTHEA in Bosnia and Herzegovina, where he led a Liaison and Observation Team. He has also worked on strategic-military affairs and military diplomacy with the German Federal Ministry of Defence and at NATO Headquarters in Brussels. Previous assignments include serving as acting legal advisor to the German National Military Representative at NATO's Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe (SHAPE) and as a reserve legal advisor at NATO's Centre of Excellence for Operations in Confined and Shallow Waters.
